Regional TVET-Conference in Viet Nam

TVET Quality Breakthrough

Background / context of the Conference

Viet Nam and Germany has been enjoying a many-year Development Cooperation, especially in the priority area of Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET) where the Government of Germany is cooperating with Vietnamese partners in upgrading quality and scale of TVET. On 11 October 2011, in Hanoi, Vietnamese Prime Minister and German Chancellor signed Hanoi Joint Statement about strategic partnership with an agreement on the joint organisation of a regional conference on TVET in 2012.

In implementation of the above assignment by the two Governments, Bundesministerium für wirtschaftliche Zusammenarbeit und Entwicklung (BMZ) has commissioned Deutsche Gesellschaft für Internationale Zusammenarbeit (GIZ) in Viet Nam, in cooperation with Viet Nam Ministry of Labour, Invalids and Social Affairs (MoLISA) to jointly prepare for and organise the TVET Conference. In Vietnamese-German Development Cooperation numerous programmes and projects on Technical Cooperation interlinked with Financial Cooperation are implemented with the aim of contributing to the goal of reform and development of TVET in Viet Nam. Two sides agreed on Conference title as “*Regional TVET Conference in Viet Nam – TVET Quality Breakthrough*”.

Conference objectives

- Attract/draw support and cooperation in the region and internationally in general, and of Germany in particular, for the betterment of legal and policies, programmes and plans on TVET of Viet Nam, especially on experience exchange, application of experiences and solutions of countries in the region and internationally for the reform and development of TVET of the country in the coming time.
- Promote and further strengthen the cooperation relationship between Viet Nam and Germany as well as with ASEAN countries in the field of TVET.

Time, venue, participants of the Conference

- Conference time: on the dates of 10-11/10/2012 (this is also the time milestone of one year of the Hanoi Joint Statement signed by the Prime Minister and the Chancellor)
- Venue: Melia Hotel Hanoi
- Participants: tentatively about 250 distinguished guests and participants, as in the following:
